



Public Safety Training – Chief Warden

This program is targeted to participants who are existing workers in the industry who may be required to lead or manage an emergency control organisation during emergencies.

PUAFER006 Lead an emergency control organisation

This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required to make decisions about the safety of occupants during a facility emergency and to give instructions on the priority order for responding to an emergency incident. It includes leading the preparation of facility emergency response procedures; commanding, controlling and coordinating facility emergency response procedures and responses and concluding the facility emergency incident. Individuals who undertake this work may also act as the primary liaison with emergency services after their arrival.

PUAFER007 Manage an emergency control organization

This unit of competency involves the skills and knowledge required by a member of an Emergency Planning Committee to document and maintain a facility emergency plan, to establish and maintain an emergency control organisation and to operate in accordance with the facility's emergency plan. It includes initiating emergency response planning, ensuring an emergency control organisation is in place, providing for initiation and control of an initial emergency response, providing for post initial response activities, planning and implementing emergency control training and providing support in the post response and/or recovery phase.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will have the skills and knowledge to lead and manage an emergency control organisation during emergencies.

Delivery mode:

The learner is required to attend a class of face to face training and assessment for the Chief Warden course incorporating the units PUAFER006 and PUAFER007.

Course duration – Class delivery and times:

Eight and a half (8.5) hours – 8.30am to 5.30pm with a half an hour lunch break.

Entry requirements:

There are no formal entry requirements for persons seeking enrolment into these units of competency.

Competent in written and spoken English

Students are required to be competent in written and spoken English to gain entry to the course. A Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment is a mandatory requirement prior to enrolment.
